FLAGS

Yellow, standing – Take care. Danger. Something has happened ahead of you. It probably isn't on the track, but normal escape routes may not be available to you, so be careful. Absolutely no passing.

Yellow, waving - Great Danger Slow Down, be prepared to stop. Something has happened ahead of you and is probably blocking at least some of the track. Be prepared to take evasive action. Be very careful. Absolutely no passing.

Yellow, Double Yellow - Displayed at all stations. Indicates that the entire course is under yellow condition. Note: A driver may encounter several flags before reaching the emergency area. The requirements are still the same "ABSOLUTELY no passing".

Red & yellow striped - This flag is yellow with vertical red stripes. There is debris on the track ahead; possibly oil, antifreeze, dirt, or a maybe a turtle. Be prepared to respond accordingly.

Red - Something very serious has happened ahead of you and you can not continue. Come to a controlled, safe stop on either edge of the track. If cars ahead of you have pulled off, use the same side of the track to allow maximum space for emergency vehicles. Stay in your car. You will be notified by the corner worker when to return to the pits.

Blue / yellow stripe - A faster car is following. Allow it to pass at the next passing zone. A small wave to let the faster car know that you saw him/her and intend to signal a pass when appropriate is helpful. This courtesy prevents tailgating and "driving in your mirrors" and promotes a safe event. Don't forget to lift after signaling a pass so the other car can get by as soon as possible

Black - Closed or furled. Pointed or shaken at an individual car means you have been observed driving in an unsafe manner. If the action continues, you shall be given an open Black Flag.

Black - Open. Enter the pits at the next opportunity to consult with a school official. Do not take another lap.

Black – Open. Displayed at all stations. The session has been halted. All cars must proceed carefully to the pits.

Black with red center - There is something mechanically wrong with your car; proceed carefully to the pits.

White - An ambulance, service vehicle or slow moving vehicle is on the course. Take care. This flag shall be shown two stations prior to the slow-moving vehicle. A standing white may be displayed at all stations on the first lap of the session to show the drivers the location of the flag stations.

Checkered - The session is over. Finish the lap as a "cool-down" lap. Slow down, use the brakes as little as is safe. Allow the car and yourself to cool down and relax. Proceed to pit lane.

Green (Solid Green) – The race or drivers' education session is underway the instant the green flag is displayed. It is normally only in possession of the starter and not displayed around the stations around the course.
